



Seattle Public Library

A. To get your free Seattle Public Library card, and, with it, access to SPL databases, bring your current Seattle Pacific University ID card to any branch of the Seattle Public Library (<http://www.spl.org/default.asp?pageID=branch>). The branch closest to SPU is the Queen Anne Branch, located at 400 West Garfield Street (corner of West Garfield Street and 4th Avenue West). To get there,



1. Head south on (i.e. *up!*) 3rd Avenue West, and turn right on West Garfield. The library will be on your right as you cross 4th Avenue West. **Or**
2. Take Metro Transit bus no. 13 southbound towards Downtown Seattle, and disembark at West Garfield. Walk west on West Garfield four blocks. The library will be on your right as you cross 4th Avenue West.

The telephone number of the Queen Anne Branch is 206 386 4227; its hours of operation are the following:

Mon-Tue	1:00 pm-8:00 pm
Wed-Thu	10:00 am-8:00 pm
Fri-Sat	10:00 am-6:00 pm

A third option: “All bus routes that provide service to downtown Seattle”, including nos. 13 and 17, “come within walking distance of the [Central Library]”

(http://www.spl.org/default.asp?pageID=branch_central&branchID=1), which has more extensive hours.

B. To access SPL databases once you have your card, go to http://www.spl.org/default.asp?pageID=collection_db_subscription, locate your database of choice, and click on the link. When prompted, enter

- your Seattle Public Library barcode number, and
- your Seattle Public Library Personal Identification Number, or PIN.

Then click on “Login”.



King County Library System

A. To get your free King County Library System card, and, with it, access to KCLS databases,

- go to http://www.kcls.org/usingthelibrary/librarycards/card_application.cfm, fill in the required fields using your SPU mailing address, and submit. Your card should be mailed within 14 days. Once you've received it, you must
- get to a branch (<http://www.kcls.org/locations/>) and present both
 - “photo ID with birth date (e.g., a driver's license, Washington State ID card, or passport)” and
 - “identification that verifies your current address” (such as, for example, an envelope addressed to you at Seattle Pacific University, and postmarked). Bring also for good measure
 - your Seattle Pacific University ID card.
- The branch closest to SPU is probably the Shoreline branch (<http://www.kcls.org/shoreline/directions.cfm>).

B. To access KCLS databases once you've done all this, go to <http://www.kcls.org/databases/>, locate your database of choice, and click on the link. Enter your KCLS library card number, and click “Submit”.
